Grace and peace. The Jews would greet one another with the term, "shalom," which means peace. Gentiles know of the Lord due to His grace that has been shed for all men.

Comfort in Suffering

³Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort,

Just as the Holy Spirit is known as the Comforter, God the Father is the comforter of all men, Jew and Gentile alike; who allow themselves to become His friend through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. We are a new creation - a new man in God's image and likeness due to His Holy Spirit indwelling the believer.

We have the Grace of God on our side and peace that passes all understanding when we accept God's one and only Son who died on the cross for the remission of sins.

Strife, anger, war; are all products of the fallen nature of man – his flesh, this fallen world and the devil. The product of Knowing God personally through Jesus is grace and peace and the eventual entrance into the <u>kingdom of God</u> where all tears are wiped away and all things are made new. ⁴ who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

Just as a good father comforts his children and does what he can to provide for them and teach them to do for themselves, our God is always there. Not that everything will be alright all the time because we know in this world we will have tribulations John 16:33, But we have the Good News that we are saved from a condemnation that is upon all who reject Christ. The suffering of this world is for a brief moment compared to the eternal glory of God's everlasting kingdom that will be established here on earth. ⁵ For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also abounds through Christ.

2 Corinthians 1:1-7 I. That We Might Comfort Others (1:1-7)

The word "comfort" is used ten times in vv. 1-7 ("consolation" in 5, 6, and 7) and literally means "to call to one's side." It is the same word Jesus used in <u>John 14:16</u> for the Spirit, the Comforter (Paraclete). What a joy it is to know that God stands at our side to help whenever we go through troubles

How many times have the wilds of the enemy entangled me in sin of one sort or another and no sooner the Lord comes by my side and assured me that things are alright. Whatever ails you, anger, regret, sadness, slander, malice, backbiting, all have been placed on Christ. Remember that the next time your blood boils or your fist clench, or your mind goes into a rage. Remember this has been laid on Jesus Christ. He took it for you upon Himself so you can have peace!
